## POLICE REPORT

### Wolds Ward Healing Update August 2023

#### Crime

There were forty six reported crimes across the Wolds Ward during July. The following offences were reported in Healing.

Copper cable was stolen from a building on a construction site at Energy Park Way between 21<sup>st</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> July, after padlocks were cut from gates giving access to the compound. The intruders then forced their way through into a substation where the cabling was removed.

There were two reports of criminal damage.

A caravan parked at an address on Fords Avenue was damaged after graffiti was painted on it.

The other report was domestic related.

One racially aggravated public order incident

There was one report of ASB. Youths setting fire to cardboard in Poplar Park.

## View from the Pew

Do we need a new way of thinking about the power of our technologies and economics of our age? Are we so conditioned by the culture in which we live?

We are all conscious of this summer of high temperatures in many parts of the world, wildfires and rising ocean temperatures. These are driving people from their homes, causing the ice caps to melt at unheard of rates, destroying wildlife. I think we are being forced to recognise that we need a radically new way of thinking and acting, being humbler and loving towards the earth we have inherited if we and the world are to survive. We have developed a culture in which we treat the earth as a resource available for economic growth, development and free trade not as God intended a place for us to live in peace with our essential needs provided.

The Parish Council produces this Newsletter, looks after the parks in the Village, own and manages the Village Hall and manages other sites such as the Moated Site, Porri's Wood and land at Quantock Gardens. It also provides the activities and events such as the Quiz Nights, the Summer Event and the Holiday Clubs.

## Healing Green Agenda Group

### Healing Green Agenda Group – Feeling the Power

It's summer and we have lots of sunshine, wind and rain. So surely that's lots of good, cheap, renewable electricity and nothing to worry about. Well, not really!!!

Just a few numbers to get started:

**As a country we are using around 32GW of electricity during the day (mostly for offices, shops and factories) and 24GW at night (mostly for lighting at home and watching TV).**

GW is short for a GigaWatt which is 1,000,000 kiloWatts (kW). An electric kettle pulls about 2.5 kW.

The National Grid are responsible for generating or acquiring all this electricity and balancing it with the national demand – second by second. They sell it to other companies who sell it to us.

So where does it come from?. There are several good websites which show a dashboard giving an update every 20 minutes or so. My favourite is **grid.iamkate.com** from which I have taken the following:

On a very good, sunny day we could get it all from renewables, up to 21GW from wind turbines and 15GW from solar panels but that has only happened for a few days – ever!!

Much more usual is 6GW from wind and 6GW from solar. That leaves 20GW to find from somewhere else. We get a steady 4GW from nuclear power, 1.25 from biomass (Drax wood chips), 0.25 from hydroelectric and 5.5GW from Europe in power cables under the North Sea. That still leaves 9GW which has to be made by burning gas (coal is now almost 0, thank goodness).

On a cloudy, calm day – like so many so far this year – **this goes up to 18GW from gas!!!** But we have absolutely no choice at the moment unless electricity is rationed, which is very unlikely to be acceptable to most people or the economy.

So what is the answer? Unfortunately, the only 2 available in the short term may be nuclear and for us to use less! More ideas very welcome.

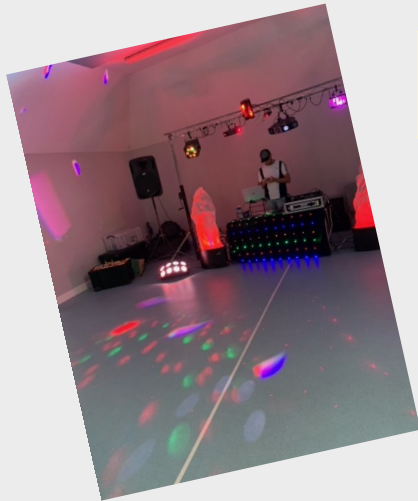
I hope to help the Parish Council keep on the good work done by it and previous Councils.
