## HEALING PARISH COUNCILNOTES FOR DECEMBER 2021/JANUARY 2022

The Council meeting for November was held in the Village Hall and saw the cooption of a new member, Cllr. Neil Cass. As well as Cllr. Cass, two other members of the public who had been present have also come forward and put themselves up for cooption to the Council. These two candidates will attend the December 2021 meeting with a view to being coopted onto the Council.

#### **Highways and Footpaths**

A quarterly highways meeting with the Parish Council and NELC/ENGIE is scheduled to be held during the first week in December and any issues within the Village will be discussed at that meeting.

#### **Planning Applications**

The planning applications considered at the meeting for November 21 were as follows:




## Village Walks

#### Overgrown hedges, trees and shrubs

The Parish Council receives lots of complaints from residents about overgrown trees/hedges/shrubs which have been allowed to grow out over footpaths and roads etc. It is sometimes a struggle for those pedestrians using the footpath to walk along when hedges etc. are so overgrown. It is also very difficult if you have a buggy/pram or are pushing a wheelchair. It is sometimes necessary to go onto the road due to these overgrown hedges etc. and that is unsafe.

Therefore, can we please remind all residents that it is an offence to allow trees/shrubs/hedges to grow over and obstruct either the footpath or the roadway outside of your property. It is also an offence to allow any overgrowth to impede visibility for motorists at junctions etc.

If residents could be mindful of this and please make sure your hedges and shrubs and any overhanging trees etc. are cut back to allow full and safe access to the area outside of your property, including the footpath and the road.

#### What else does the Parish Council do?

Again, NELC consult with the Parish Council over all sorts of issues such as refuse collection, recycling targets and issues, major schemes within the Borough which could impact on Healing etc.

The PC also receives links to all the major meetings of NELC, such as Cabinet Meetings etc. so it can see items on the agendas.

Within the village, the Parish Council helps organise the Remembrance Day Parade with British Legion, it provides a Christmas Tree each year and organises events for the Village.

Running the Village Hall for local residents means it also liaises with Village Groups such as the Brownies, Mother and Toddlers etc. and it also supports other groups and organisations within the Village such as the Healing Nursery and Out of School Club, the Scouts and also assists the St Peter and Paul Church by making a contribution to its grass cutting of the Churchyard each year.

In running the Hall, local groups are supported by special community hiring rates and local groups and clubs providing activities for local residents are actively promoted.

#### Who can be a Parish Councillor?

If you are over 18 years of age, live in the Village or have your main place of work within the Village, you can put yourself forward to be a Council member. You don't need any particular experience, just a positive attitude towards doing something to help improve, maintain and enhance the general environment of the Village. There is not an election each year, but elections are held every 4 years. In between election years, new members can be 'co-opted' on to the Council to fill a vacancy.

Parish Council members come from all walks of life, all age groups and from every part of the community. Anyone interested in getting involved in the management of the Village should come along to a meeting.

#### What does the Parish Council own in our Village?

The Parish Council owns the Village Hall (the new build), the Moated Site (the sheep field), Cornflower Copse, the footpath between The Avenue and Station Road and the land at the end of Quantock Gardens. It also owns the Village War Memorial, the Healing Cenotaph, at the top of The Avenue, which it holds in trust for the village of Healing. It also leases, from NELC, the two parks at Fords Avenue and Poplar Road and also leases Porri's Wood from NELC.

Leasing the parks makes the Parish Council responsible for all the maintenance, grass cutting, bowling green and tennis court maintenance and yearly inspections for safety of the play equipment etc.

#### What Decisions can the Parish Council make?

The Parish Council makes its own decisions on the management of its community buildings and land it owns and leases.

It is also consulted on every planning application which is submitted within the Village to the local planning authority, which is NELC. NELC write and tell the Parish Council about every application within Healing and usually on its boundaries. A decision is made at the PC meeting as to whether the application should be agreed with or objected to and then the comments are sent to NELC who use these to help decide the outcome of the planning application. The Parish Council also has the power to request that a planning application should go before the Planning Committee to be decided rather than just being decided by a Planning Officer.

With highways and traffic issues, the Parish Council holds quarterly meetings with NELC and works very closely with the Traffic Team Manager, Civil Enforcement and Road Safety . These meetings decide policy for highways and traffic issues which will affect Healing and again comments/proposals/objections from the Parish Council are considered as part of the process with any works committed to by NELC.

The Parish Council can also request, and indeed often does, speed monitoring in the Village and the results are then shared with it by NELC. Recent speed monitoring results have actually just been received.

#### WHAT DOES YOUR PARISH COUNCIL DO?

#### WHO ARE YOUR LOCAL COUNCIL MEMBERS?

The Parish Council often receives requests from residents for help with various issues, some of which it unfortunately has no remit to deal with and it can sometimes be difficult explaining to residents that the Parish Council has no jurisdiction over certain matters. Also, when looking to coopt new members, the Council often hears the words, 'Well I thought I'd come along and see what happens, because I don't really know what the Council does'.

Therefore, the Council members thought it might be useful to high-light the work of your Parish Council so you can see what it does in the Village and what remit it has over issues which affect all of you as residents. In the next few issues, we will also be running the Know Your Councillor articles from our newer members so you can see who the members of your Parish Council are and learn more about them.

#### What is a Parish Council?

Parish Councils were created by an act of Parliament and they are, basically, your first tier of local Government. Your Parish Council is pretty much the same as North East Lincs Council, but just smaller and non-political. All the members are village residents and do not sit on the Council representing any political party—all members of the Parish Council are independent.

At Healing there are 10 available 'seats' on the Council.

#### View from the Pew

#### Shall I Tell You Why I'm Really Here?

My wife and I met a woman recently who told us of a retreat she had been to earlier this year. She had gone there for some space and solitude, a chance to reflect on her life's priorities and direction. There was a gentleman also on the retreat and, over lunch, they introduced themselves to each other and chatted about their reasons for taking time out. That done, there was a pause in the conversation. The man leaned over and said to her in a hushed tone, "Shall I tell you why I'm really here?"

Our lives may be characterised as having two layers; an outer zone and an inner realm. The outer zone is what other people see; our physical appearance, our known opinions, our social / professional / domestic personas. The inner realm is who we <u>really</u> are, our heartfelt longings, convictions, fears, hopes etc. This is an extreme simplification, of course, but you get the point.

The world into which Jesus was born was, in many ways, little different from ours. Certainly, human psychology was similar: people fretting and fussing over the stuff of daily life, concerned with their routines and outward appearance or social status. Beneath that layer of froth lay the deeper soil of the heart, with its mixture of virtues and vices. In his ministry, Jesus spoke repeatedly about matters concerning the interior life, and his words still carry profound resonance to this day of busyness and distractions.

To look at it in a topical way, our lives are like Christmas gifts. There is the wrapping, all shiny and attractive - we don't wrap presents in old newspaper or brown paper, do we? The wrapper gives clues to what lies beneath, a hint of the shape perhaps, but it can also mislead. The actual gift, what you <u>really</u> want to discover, lies within. We put so much effort into our lives' shiny wrapping but so little time reflecting on and nurturing the gift inside.

Christmas, likewise, has a two-layer aspect; the lights and decorations, gifts and sprouts, etc, but also the deeper quality, acknowledging and celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ with grateful hearts. What is Christmas really about?

May you have a happy and blessed Christmas.
