# Highways/footpaths

# Hedge and Tree Maintenance



### A real Christmas tree

A real Christmas tree, laden with lights and lametta, is a beautiful thing, the sight and smell of it evoking memories of festive magic. However, Christmas trees are precarious and unstable, prone to toppling, especially if a cat decides to climb up it (do an internet search for 'cat christmas tree disaster video'). Out in nature, a domestic cat would present no threat to a small fir tree but, in the context of a tree inside a house, it can lead to chaos. A Christmas tree all about appearance, it may look good, but, having no roots, it lacks resilience.

Over the years, I have had times ... decades perhaps ... where my focus has been on appearance rather than roots. I'm not talking necessarily about my physical looks (you can't make a silk purse out of a sow's ear), but more about how I could achieve things or complete tasks. Beneath the branches and the output, the roots were meagre, resulting in defensiveness to prop up my ego. I am not using this piece as a confessional, though perhaps you may also identity with aspects of my selfappraisal. With age comes, what, weight? Perhaps, but also hopefully a degree of wisdom. A couple of years ago, from the comfort of a warm room, I watched two tall pine trees being mercilessly buffeted by stormforce winds. The trees swayed, but they did not topple.

To those who have ears to hear, Jesus says, 'I am the vine, you are the branches. Abide in me and I will abide in you'. How rooted are you? How resilient is your spirit to the various storms of life? There have been some fierce gales over the past few years that we've all had to endure, and they look set to continue into 2023. In the account of the first Christmas, Mary and Joseph faced many serious trials, barely hinted at in the school nativity plays. The depth of their faith kept them going; their resilience stemmed from their rootedness in God. In the new year, why not pledge to deepen your own rootedness by taking a step of faith and discovering that 'in quietness and trust is your strength' (Isaiah 30 vs 15). # **Healing Green Agenda Group**

The first meeting of the group was held at the Village Hall on 15<sup>th</sup> November and got off to a really positive and constructive start. We already have people with a broad range of "green" backgrounds from planting bulbs around the village to working in the environmental departments of Grimsby Council and local industry.

The ideas for projects and activities of a "green" nature turned out to be quite extensive. However, the main theme was that this should be something that the whole village can be involved with and share. It's not just achieving and understanding a nicer and greener looking environment, it's about doing it together.

### So what is on the agenda?

This will be firmed up over the next few meetings, but in general terms we have:

### Short Term Projects:

- Communal (dead) Christmas Tree shredder and mulch recycling.
- More making and placing of planters and looking after them.
- More planting of bulbs and other shrubs, including in grass verges if allowed.
- Elimination of widespread use of weed killers that harm wildlife.
- Set up a website to record and promote all that is going on.

### Medium Term Projects:

• Community vegetable garden with special emphasis on education (adults as well as children!). First step is to draw up plans and determine the practicality.

Hello everyone.

My name is Ken Barr. I came to live in Healing when I was twenty years old and I am still here seventy years later, so I think I will stay here now that the villagers have started speaking to me.

I used to look forward to receiving the Village News because there was always something interesting such as a poem that had been written (I was a contributor) or a recipe I was not a contributor)

In the latest issue, we were asked to contribute something so I thought that this might bring a smile to your face.

While writing the history of his village, the vicar of Eye near Peterborough decided to write about past dignitaries.

The reverend Philip Randall was particularly impressed by a tombstone inside St Matthew's church. On this tombstone in quite ornate lettering were the letters H.W. P.

The vicar pored over parish records for an unbelievable nine years, looking for information on anyone with those initials.

He came across a Henry Wimbourne Potter, but there was nothing of importance attached to the name, as was the case of a Mr. Henry Winston Pitstock.

Eventually, in 1971 he gave up and as a last resort he put a letter in the local Village News to ask if anyone could shed any light on this inscription.

Two days later he got a telephone call from a parishioner who explained to him that his late father had been an engineer and was working on a project in the area of the tomb and not wanting to spoil the decor of the church with a modern poster, he got a local engraver to put the letters

there. They signified HOT WATER PIPE.



• Nature/memorial garden with seating, aromatic plants, bird feeders, etc. Again, plan and determine feasibility.

Longer Term Projects:

• Surveys of local flora and fauna. Followed by actions to improve biodiversity and protecting anything that needs it. Hopefully, a good project to get the schools involved with.

• Making the website a source of information on the more technical stuff such as rainwater harvesting, energy efficiency, carbon footprints, etc – and what can be done to improve.

Arrange open day events with guest speakers and activities.

Next meeting will be on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> December at the Village Hall starting at 7pm.

In the meantime keep an eye on the noticeboard by the school.
