The Council meeting for December saw the cooption of 2 new members, Cllrs. Carol Hawkins and Dave Spreadborough. This now brings the Council number back up to 8 with 2 remaining casual vacancies. The January meeting was held as usual in the Village hall.

The Parish Council continues to receive its monthly police report, which is published in the News each month.

Village Hall Project

The build is now complete apart from minor snagging works and flooring works are now imminent, hopefully to be completed by the end of February.

As soon as the flooring is laid, then the new building can be used and all hirings will be transferred over. An opening/welcome event will be organised so that residents can come and see the new facility.

Parks and other sites

The Council has accepted the offer of some free play equipment and it will be sited on the Fords Avenue park. Hodson and Kauss, a local contractors, will be carrying out the relocation works for this project as soon as possible.

Finance

The budget meeting was held as part of the December meeting and set a budget for fy 22/23 and a precept figure for Healing Village for fy 22/23 which has been requested from NELC.

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POLICE REPORT

Wolds Ward Healing Update January 2022

Crime

There were forty-one reported crimes across the Wolds Ward during December, of which eleven have occurred in Healing.

During the early hours of 12th December a car parked on Wisteria Drive was entered. A coat and loose change were stolen.

Overnight 19th & 20th December a car parked on Acorn Close was entered. Cash and keys were stolen.

Christmas decorations were damaged at a home on Snowdrop Close on New Years Eve. This homeowner has also suffered repeated harassment from youths over recent weeks.

Other offences include:

Three minor public order offences involving the same parties.

Two reports of stalking.

One report of sending malicious communications.

Theft of a bike from a driveway on Fords Avenue.

Into January, there have been five crimes reported so far (7th Jan) in the Wolds Ward. One of these relates to Healing, a stalking offence which is a continuation of one reported in December.

There have been five reports of ASB.

Three regarding the incidents on Snowdrop Close.

Motorbike being ridden illegally through the village.

One neighbour dispute.

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

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UPDATE NEWS!!!

The new village hall project

This project is now completed with regard to the building works. The Council is now organising the safety flooring to be fitted, with the first stage of these works completed in mid-January. The main flooring to the new main hall cannot be laid until the new slab for the floor is totally dry so this will take a few weeks extra to complete.

The new hall is designed with a larger main hall, access out onto the bowling green to the rear, a large kitchen and enhanced storage facilities. There are toilet facilities, a disabled toilet and also a meeting room/conference room which is at the opposite end of the building to the main hall, thus facilitating dual usage of the main hall and meeting room by different groups at the same time.

There is also a large reception area and underfloor heating to the main Hall floor, along with large floor to ceiling windows all along the length of the new main hall. There is also a heightened ceiling so that bouncy castles etc. can fit easily into the Hall.

A moving over date is yet to be confirmed but all of the regular hirers will move to the new facility with us and an open/welcome event will be held for residents to come and take a look at the new facility. Of course there is improved parking at the new Hall with more parking spaces for users.



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Summer Event to mark Queen's Platinum

The celebrations commence on Thursday 2nd June and run for the whole weekend. The Parish Council will be organising an event for the village and further details will follow. 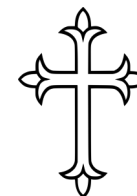

Overgrown hedges, trees and shrubs

The Parish Council receives lots of complaints from residents about overgrown trees/hedges/shrubs which have been allowed to grow out over footpaths and roads etc. It is sometimes a struggle for those pedestrians using the footpath to walk along when hedges etc. are so overgrown. It is also very difficult if you have a buggy/pram or are pushing a wheelchair. It is sometimes necessary to go onto the road due to these overgrown hedges etc. and that is unsafe.

Therefore, can we please remind all residents that it is an offence to allow trees/shrubs/hedges to grow over and obstruct either the footpath or the roadway outside of your property. It is also an offence to allow any overgrowth to impede visibility for motorists at junctions etc.

If residents could be mindful of this and please make sure your hedges and shrubs and any overhanging trees etc. are cut back to allow full and safe access to the area outside of your property, including the footpath and the road.

View from the Pew

As we begin to come to terms with a new Year and look towards Easter, I am reminded that the good will and care already shown to many by others, needs to continue. We are still in the grips of a really difficult time and there is no short-term solution, so we need to continue to be kind to each other and share our joys and our difficult times together.

There is an old saying which goes "if you do something right no one remembers, if you do something wrong no one forgets".

That is certainly true in my role within the church and wider community. Putting people down is not a good practice and often shows your own vulnerability, my Grandad was always looking for what was wrong in everything. The reason I use this story is that to this day I will never forget his negative attitude towards what for me was a real triumph. We should treat each other with respect and grace even in difficult times and remember that something you say might be in someone else's mind for the rest of their lives. Jesus said,

"So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you", (Matthew 7:12).
