VOTER ID—NEW FOR VOTING IN 2023

2023 sees the introduction of new legislation which requires anyone going to vote in any local or national elections to produce photo ID. This will be the form of a valid passport or driving licence or, if you don't have either of those, a voter ID card.

Without the above you will NOT be able to vote in elections.

The Government has just launched a portal whereby you can apply online for a voter ID card and we will put further details in the next magazine.

Anyone who doesn't have the required valid ID and doesn't have access to the internet to register for a voter ID card can apply through a paper form and the Parish Clerk can assist with this if you contact her.

Crime



Healing Green Agenda Group

The Group had its second meeting in December which, again, was very enthusiastic. Our list of green "Projects" is coming along nicely with several new ideas being added. We will be putting more detail on all these ideas at the next meeting or two.

Precept Increases to each house band for coming year of 23/24.

The Council Tax Base figure for Healing Village, set by NELC, is 1,175.25. Using this to calculate the precept figures for each house band results in the following increase per house per year.

Increase per house per year

Band A will be	£36.87 per year	£1.80
Band B will be	£43.01 per year	£2.09
Band C will be	£49.16 per year	£2.40
Band D will be	£55.31 per year	£2.70
Band E will be	£67.60 per year	£3.30
Band F will be	£79.89 per year	£3.90
Band G will be	£92.18 per year	£4.50

The figures may vary by a penny or so, depending on the means of calculation by NELC's accounting system but this shows the precept figure which will be levied on each house in the village for the coming year and the increase per house, per year from the current year's cost.

Village Hall, selling of advertising in the Healing News and any funds taken from events. There is also a subsidy from NELC for park maintenance and Ward Councillor funding.

The Hall revenue each year is approximately £12k, the advertising from the Newsletter approx. £1k and any funds raised from events are used to fund the staging of the next event.

The Parks subsidy is usually around £6,500 each year which offsets the costs of park and bowling green maintenance and Ward Councillor funding is given to assist with projects with approximately £2k received during this last year.

PRECEPT SETTING FOR FY 23/24

The Precept has been set at £65,000 for the coming year and this has now been requested from NELC for the new financial year.

HEALING VILLAGE BUDGET AND PRECEPT

FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 23-24

The Parish Council met in January 2023 to set its budget for the coming year of 23-24 and also to set the precept requirement for Healing Village.

The budget agreed is as follows:

Administration

£7,450.00

This includes office expenses, telephones, insurance,

membership to professional bodies and county associations, the provision of Christmas trees, footpath expenses and also any works to Porri's Wood.

Awards/Healing News

£11,800.00

This includes grant aid, any other awards made by the Council and the printing and distribution of the Healing News for the year.

Payroll/Staffing costs

£30,000.00

The Parish Council employs5 permanent members of staff and this covers salaries, national insurance and pension contributions etc.

Village Hall

£14,740.00

This covers all costs for the operation of the Village Hall excluding staffing costs—e.g. energy costs, water rates, business rates, insurance, cleaning materials, repairs and maintenance.

Extras/Capital Projects

£23,550.00

This covers a donation to the Church for assistance with grass cutting in the churchyard, maintenance of the Moated Site, Cornflower Copse and Quantock Gardens—all land owed and managed by the Parish Council. Also included in this figure are the loan repayments for the loan taken out to finish the build of the new Village Hall, activities such as holiday club provision, park maintenance and events.

TOTAL BUDGET SET FOR FY 23/24 £87,540.00

The Parish Council also holds a small reserve amount which is the remainder of the bonded sum given for the ongoing maintenance of land at Quantock Gardens. The Council does not own Porri's Wood but leases it from NELC, along with the two parks in the Village—Poplar Road Park and Fords Avenue Park.

Each year NELC gives a subsidy to the Parish Council for maintenance of the Parks but this only covers grass cutting, maintenance of the bowling green and hedge cutting. Any park improvements and maintenance of play equipment is the responsibility of the Parish Council.
