Parks and Land Management

The Council has now put in place a management plan for the Moated Site and nettles have been cut back in January and the old inner perimeter fencing has now been fully removed.

All other sites were being maintained as usual with grass cutting coming to a stop on the parks for the winter months and remedial works to the bowling green being carried out between seasons. The tennis court nets are now being stored for winter and the court surface cleaned and made ready for Spring 2024.

Finance

The nine month/third quarter accounts were approved at the January 2024 meeting and the budget set.

Staffing budget for the year had already been agreed and this was incorporated into the budget.

The budget was set t £90,390 for the year 24/25 and the precept requirement for the Village was set at £72,500.

View from the Pew—February 2024

Maybe as you watch the TV news or hear of problems in your Church or community you may feel that that your world is not just in the grip of winter but also of darkness. The darkness of the planet being destroyed by climate change. The darkness of the increasing number of people struggling with debt and homelessness. This is also a world of increasing violence and war international and locally. All these are caused by us humans. Where can you find hope in these situations to restore the world to be a better place? Can you do anything?

Healing Moated Site

The fencing on the inner perimeter of the site has now been removed and the nettles have been strimmed and more treatment for the banks of nettles will be carried out in March when new growth can be treated and hopefully some of the nettles eradicated.

There will be some extra paths cut into the site to allow easier access across and through the site and further plans are ongoing to enhance the biodiversity of the site.

Defibrillator Information

The Parish Council currently manages 2 defibrillators within the Village which are for public use and accessible 24/7.

The first is at the British Legion Club and the second is at the Working Men's Club on Rookery Road.

These are both accessible at all times. There is a code which is given when you make the phone call to the emergency services and this then opens the boxes.

The Parish Council pays LIVES to manage and maintain the two machines for it each year and it has just organised a new box for the defibrillator at the Working Men's Club.

Each defib box also has information on it which shows the postcode location of the machine and also the 'what three words' location.

Healing Green Agenda Group


After a bit of time off over the Christmas period it's already starting to look much greener for the year ahead.

On a cool but sunny New Year's Day a group of 6 did a flowering plant survey/hunt of the Moated Settlement site. This is part of a national project run by the Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland (<https://nyph.bsbi.org>), which is supported by one of the group. It took well over an hour to walk round the site and peer into all the corners but the result was a total of 6 plants – a few more than I was expecting! These were Periwinkle, Dandelion, Daisy, Shepherd's Purse, Aconite and Petty Spurge (for which a magnifying glass was required). This is now on the national database and will be repeated every year to see how things improve. We have some way to go as one group on the Norfolk coast apparently recorded 67 plants!!!

We again arranged the Christmas Tree recycling at Poplar Road Park. This was even better than last year with about 60 trees being brought in. They will be shredded and the resulting mulch used on the Moated Settlement – this may involve a volunteer wheel barrow push or two.

On a national note – the record for wind power generation was broken on 21st December with 21.81 GW being produced for half an hour. The previous record was a bit over 21 GW on 10th January 2023, so not a huge step forward. The main problem now is access from the windfarms to the national grid – otherwise quite a bit more should be possible.

Finally, several get togethers have been held at the Village Hall to progress plans for green things to do with the Moated Settlement and Porri's Wood. These will continue on most Thursday evenings from 7.30 to 8.30 ish. They are not formal meetings – more of a chat over coffee and biscuits – so please feel free to drop in and talk about anything green that you want. Keep an eye on the Village Notice Board.

The Parish Council has therefore set its budget at £93,390 for the financial year 24/25.

The Precept for Healing Village has been set at £72,500 and below shows a table on how that should break down into the house bands when Council Tax bills are sent out.

This current year's precept was £55.31 for a Band D house—Band D being the average used.

This means that the increase for a Band D property in the Village will be £4.45 per year which equates to 37 pence per month.
