The Council meeting for February 2021 was held virtually in line with restriction guidelines. Residents are welcome to attend the meetings and agendas carry the Zoom code at the top of the agenda to allow access to the meetings.

Highways and Footpaths

The Council continues to liaise with NELC closely over any traffic matters in the village and noted that enforcement officers had been in attendance at both the school areas and also elsewhere throughout the village, reinforcing the recently installed TRO and also the restrictions outside of the schools. NELC is looking at a village-wide plan to address traffic issues within the Village and the Council awaits consultation on the details for this scheme. Other issues include looking at speed reduction on Stallingborough Road and upgrading the speed signs within the village.

Planning Applications

The planning applications considered at the meeting for the last two meetings were as follows:

Planning Application Reference: DM/0023/21/FUL

Proposal: Variation of Conditions 2 (Approved Plans), 3 (External Materials), 4 (Obscured Glazing) & 5 (Rainwater Discharge) as granted on DM/0461/20/FUL including alterations to roof layout, side ground and first floor extension removed, side window added at first floor, brickwork to render at first floor, front door at ground floor changed to window and installation of bi-folding doors to ground floor to rear

Location: 16 Radcliffe Road Healing

Members had received objections from neighbouring property and agreed that the rainwater discharge for condition 5 was under question. Members to reiterate concerns over this and previous objections.

Planning Application Reference: DM/0038/21/FULA

Proposal: Erect first floor extension above ground floor flat roof Location: 38 Fords Avenue Healing Cllr. Mooney had declared prejudicial interest and took no part in discussion or debate. No objections Over.....

Planning Application Reference: DM/0116/21/FUL

Proposal: Erect two storey extension to side and single storey extension to rear

Location: 18 Oak Road Healing

Members noted plans had been amended to address previous objections and there were no objections.

The Parish Council had received some information on the proposed solar farm adjacent to fields off Aylesby Lane and a formal planning application was awaited. The Members will be inviting a representative from the project to attend a meeting to give all necessary information.

Police Matters

The Parish Council continues to receive its monthly police report, which is published in the News each month.

Parks and other sites

Winter maintenance continued at the sites and usual maintenance would recommence in late March/April 2021 depending on weather.

Parish Council Vacancies

There is still a casual vacancy on the Council which can be filled by co-option. Anyone interested should speak to an existing member, or ring the Clerk for an informal chat and for more information. Candidates are asked to come and sit through at least one Council meeting before they can be considered for cooption.

Village Hall

The Hall remained closed at the time of going to press, due to the current lockdown restrictions.

Village Hall project

The Council was proceeding in its sale of the Hall with the purchaser seeking planning permission for a change of use. The outcome of this was awaited whilst possible start dates for the new Hall project were being discussed with the building contractor appointed.

POLICE REPORT

Wolds Ward Healing Update March 2021

Crime

There were 26 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward during January, of which six occurred in Healing.

Overnight 19th & 20th January a building site compound was entered off Larkspur Avenue. A storage container has been broken into and plant machinery stolen. On 29th January storage containers within a factory compound on EuroParc were broken into and tools were stolen.

On 12th January two men in a white Ford Transit van have driven onto company grounds at EuroParc. The men have loaded the van with items from the yard. They were approached by security who managed to recover some items before the van drove away with the remaining items. There were three assaults reported.

Into February, there have been two reports involving malicious communications. During the evening of 3rd February, four men from the Scunthorpe <u>area</u> were arrested following a report of them being on site acting suspiciously at a factory on EuroParc.

There has been one report of ASB, regarding a vehicle parking on the grass verge on The Avenue.

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and antisocial behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations.

Census 2021

Census 2021 will provide a snapshot of modern society

Households across North East Lincolnshire will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021.

The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

It will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets.

"A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in the places where they are most needed," Iain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said.

"This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That's why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them."

Census day will be on March 21, but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March.

It seems quite a while since I wrote this column, but everything is moving at slower pace than normal, whatever normal is now-a-days. For most of us our world has become very small, mainly consisting of the four walls that are our home, for me the study window is now my main outlook on the world and, if it were not for taking the dog for a walk and the occasional job which requires me to actually to go out, my world is very limited. That is the same for most of us I guess and rightly, so we need to stay safe and protect others, we often forget that staying in is not just for our sake but also to help stop the spread of this very contagious and deadly virus. For church it is a very testing time, not being able to celebrate God's love together, having to look at new ways to worship via phone or the internet and not having the social side of the church's life all adds up to a very trying time. We should however remember those who are far worse off than we are. I attended a funeral yesterday of a friend, but it was virtual, I was sat at home while the funeral was in Boston.
