And whilst we're on the topic of milestones it is a real pleasure to be able to report that the sale of the existing Village Hall on Great Coates Road has been completed. A condition of the sale was that the purchaser would not take possession until such time as our new build and refurbishment of the pavilion, on Poplar playing field, is complete. We expect that our local builder will be on site by August, that the build will take in the region of three or so months to complete and we should therefore be in a position to move into our new facility certainly before Christmas. Hirings and lettings in the existing Village Hall will continue uninterrupted whilst the new build is taking place and we will move across to the new site without any interruption to the activities taking place in the old hall.

We are really looking forward to having this new facility available for the whole village in a good central location with plenty of open space around it. It will have much greater potential with the sport and play opportunities right next door to the Hall itself and we envisage that it will become a real hub which will be of benefit to everybody in the village in the years ahead.

The Council meeting for April 2021 was held virtually in line with restriction guidelines. Residents are welcome to attend the meetings and agendas carry the Zoom code at the top of the agenda to allow access to the meetings.

Highways and Footpaths

NELC will be consulting shortly on further plans for easing traffic congestion in the village, especially around the schools and works are already in the programme for resurfacing of Great Coates Road and improvement works to the bus stop on Low Road.

The Council also received a short presentation on a potential planning application for both residential and mixed-business use on a site close to the Manor on Stallingborough Road. This is an early stage proposal presented to the Council for information only.

Police Matters

The Parish Council continues to receive its monthly police report, which is published in the News each month.

Parks and other sites

Now that building works are due to commence in August, the bowling club will use the bowling green for their fixtures until that time and then play any remaining matches on away greens for the rest of the season.

Porri's Wood continues to be managed by the Council with some works scheduled in for boundary tree treatment.

The ditch on Cornflower Copse will also soon be tidied up.

The Council did hold a Stewardship Agreement with Natural England for the Healing Moated Site. This has now expired, and the Council has decided not to renew the agreement, which will give them more freedom to manage the land without the restrictions contained in the agreement.

The main management issue is to keep the thistles down on the site and maintain fencing to contain the sheep on the site.

Into April, a male has been arrested for burglary following an incident at an elderly resident's property. This person is currently on bail pending other enquiries.

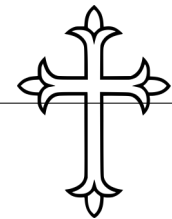

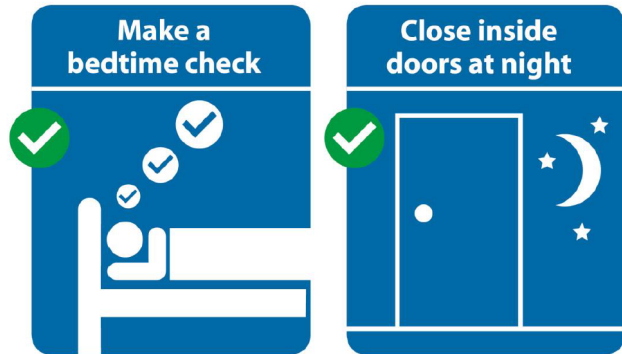

I feel it important to pass on concerns expressed to me recently about the potential and real exploitation of vulnerable and elderly people in the village. The example quoted to me by a reliable, responsible member of the public who is unable to post on this group, was that an elderly gentleman was persuaded to buy some items of indifferent quality by an individual with no official identification. The price then demanded by the hawker was ludicrously exorbitant i.e. £80. The flustered gentleman offered what he had in cash, £30, and was told that it was acceptable. I think we should all do what we can to warn our vulnerable neighbours against such 'salesmen', to advise them to ask for and insist on identification and/or proof of charitable status, and to discourage such hawkers ourselves, so that the village does not gain a reputation among such unprincipled people as a profitable ground for their 'business'.

View from the pew

Selwyn Hughes (1928-2006) was (and is) a highly-regarded pastor, author and counsellor. He created the devotional series "Every Day With Jesus" which has a global circulation of around one million readers. His insight and guidance have been an inspiration to many and few can deny the effectiveness of his ministry as he used his God-given gifts. I have just finished reading his autobiography, 'My Story', and was impressed by his honesty about his failings every bit as much as being inspired by his successes. From being a headstrong and rebellious youth in South Wales, he made a commitment to Christ and, in time, became a Pastor before branching out into various forms of creative ministry. On this journey, Selwyn acknowledged many mistakes caused by inexperience, pride or arrogance. His reluctance to let go of the detailed management of his creations prompted episodes of friction and division. The book describes the bad as well as the good.

In the Gospel of Mark, disciple Peter denied Jesus three times in the courtyard. Jesus had predicted as much and Peter had refuted it, but still it happened. The interesting thing here is that the Gospel of Mark is traditionally believed to be the narrative given by Peter to John Mark, his travelling companion. If I were Peter, dictating a Gospel, I would have been tempted to conveniently leave my failings out of the text. The Gospel of Andrew Gadd would have been a sanitised, airbrushed masterpiece, charting the highs and the ... highs ... of my association with Jesus' ministry.

Through the honesty of others about their fears and failings, we get to share in their journey to a depth that is not possible if only the 'good bits' are presented. Vulnerability, previously seen as an indication of weakness, is becoming regarded as a strength. We know this to be the case; have you ever seen someone share some difficult and honest truth on a platform to an audience? The response to them afterwards will typically be "You were very brave to share as you did." Vulnerability is bravery. Authenticity is connection. I am immensely thankful that the Gospel writers left the embarrassing failings in their stories as well as the celebratory successes. We see the arguments, the doubts, the denials, the betrayals. And in their accounts, I see myself. May you be brave and vulnerable, strong and authentic. Every blessing. Andrew Gadd
