## View from the Pew

How much do you matter to yourself? Do you feel that people ought to acknowledge you as important because you have a particular gift? Maybe you are very good to look at. Maybe you are very clever academically. Maybe you are the best at your job among your work colleagues. Or maybe you feel you are not worth anything, that people scorn you because you don't look right or don't know how to behave or can't hold down a worthwhile job or can't look after your family properly.

How we think about ourselves can be crucial in the ordinary round of everyday life. So how do we settle for what is best for each one of us? One of the key things can be our inmost thoughts about the purpose of our lives. Perhaps the key lies in our inward feeling about the purpose of our individual life. We might feel that life owes us the best because we feel we are the most important person in our little world. That's all very well, but it can lead to a big disaster if something happens to bring our whole little self-centred world crashing down! On the other hand, if we dedicate our life to helping others, that too can bring great hurt if our efforts are not acknowledged.

A big difference can come if we are conscious of a bigger picture – that there is a creative spiritual force at the centre of the whole of life, which is a source of great love and guidance as to how to make that love at the centre of human life. Experience of that guiding force can make all the difference to our world. I personally felt called early in life to be a Methodist preacher. When I have to lead worship I come into our prayer room and ask God what He wants in the worship I have to lead. A few years ago, I was due to lead a service, and I felt that God was saying to me “Preach on the words of St. Paul “we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet” My brother phoned earlier in the day I was due to take the service, to say that my Dad was dying. Just as I was going out through the door to take the service, the phone went – my Dad had died, And I had been given the text on which to preach “We shall all be changed....”. I felt God was very near at that crucial time.

Come to God in prayer and your life can be transformed!

### General Matters

During the financial year 22/23 the main projects were finishing the new build hall outside and installing the new zip wire. A big thank you to Mr. Clive Thornley who helped with the improvement to the Village Hall Car Park at no cost to the Council.

The Parish Council continues to maintain a dialogue with the local policing team, although there is very limited attendance at meetings, but monthly written reports continue to be received.

The Parish Council organised the Remembrance Day Event in November in liaison with the Royal British Legion, which was very well attended as always. Thanks to the Parade Marshall, Mr. Wayne Okopskyj, for his help in planning the event and all others who helped on the day.

During the year the Council has been running events at the new Village Hall to encourage use by residents of the new facility. Very popular quiz nights have been held throughout the year and our thanks to Alexanders Plaice for supplying the pie and peas each time and also to all those who have attended. There are usually around 70 people at each quiz and they are proving very popular. Also the Parish Council provided a Christmas party for residents, free of charge, which was enjoyed by those who came.

The Ward Councillors for the Wolds Ward, which includes Healing Village, were Cllrs. David Hasthorpe and Henry Hudson, with Cllr. Hasthorpe attending the majority of the Parish Council meetings.

**Annual Report and Accounts continued.....**

Zip wire purchase for park funded by Awards for All - £8,262

Highways/Footpaths/Land management - £2,777 on grass cutting and general maintenance, tree maintenance on the sites owned by the Council and works on the Healing Moated Site

General admin - £12,000 which covers insurances, subscriptions to local authority organisations, training, stationery and office expenses, website provision, internal and external audit services, maintenance of the defibrillators under a contract with LIVES and also purchase of new projector for meetings

Final provision for new hall - £3,810 covering final finishing to project.

As with each year, the Parish Council met to set the precept and agree its budget in January 2023 for the coming year 23/24 and during the year the Council complied with its statutory requirements to have both an internal and external audit carried out. The Council's internal auditor for the year was Mr. M. Peterson and the external auditor (appointed through the DCLG) was PKF Littlejohn, based in Canary Wharf, London. There were no required outcomes from the audit which was conducted.

The Parish Council complied with the requirements of the audit regulations and advertised a period for electors to inspect the accounts should they wish to do so. The Parish Council also publishes its financial information on its website during the year.

## **Finance**

The precept set by the Parish Council for 22/23 was £60,000.

Other income came from the following sources:

Hall Revenue - £11,841

Newsletter advertising - £2,888

VAT reclaimed from previous year - £2,608

Lottery Funding for Park equipment - £10,000

Ward Cllr. funding - £2,900

Events Income – £1,383

Parks subsidy from NELC - £6,500

Basic expenditure was as follows:

Village Hall expenditure - £17,00(excluding the costs of staffing) this includes some new equipment, loan repayment against loan taken towards new hall build, water rates, the Performing Rights Society licence, heating and lighting and general everyday maintenance and repairs and a proportion of the insurance cover of the Council. Business rates were given free of charge for the year as part of local business support assistance.

Staffing costs - £27,774 which covers 6 permanent staff positions – the Parish Clerk, four staff positions at the Village Hall and 1 position for a litter picker. The expenditure includes staff salaries, relief/holiday cover for the village hall, administration and all Inland Revenue PAYE payments, pension contributions and Employer's Liability cover. Rates for salaries are set either with national living wage rates or through NALC for Government Officers salary scales.

Donations - £800 which goes to the Church to assist with its grass cutting maintenance.

Newsletter - £11,587 which covers printing and distribution costs.

Maintenance of the park sites - £14,636

## Healing Village Hall

The Village Hall changed its operating system when the new Hall became operational.

The Parish Council still employs two job-share members of staff for the Village Hall during the week and two job-share members who act as weekend care-takers.

During the year revenue generated from Hall usage was £11,842 this is a 47% increase on the previous year, although the previous year's income had been impacted by the pandemic and somewhat limited use of the Hall over that previous year.

## Land ownership

The Parish owns the Moated Manor Site, Cornflower Copse and land at Quantock Gardens. It also leases Porri's Wood, Fords Avenue Park and Poplar Road Park from NELC. Routine maintenance is built in each year for the sites.

The Parish Council conducts bi-annual inspections of all of its Sites, as required by the insurance cover and submits a report to the Council meetings for works to be agreed and then carried out.

For the two park areas, the Parish Council is responsible for grass cutting, hedge cutting, tree maintenance, playground equipment inspection and maintenance, emptying the bins, tennis court maintenance and also the Bowling Green maintenance.

The Healing Bowling Club donate towards the maintenance of the bowling green which it uses as its home ground.

The costs of maintaining the Parks for the year is subsidised by NELC, with the Parish Council responsible for business rates, insurance and utility costs for water and energy. NELC supports the Parish Council by reimbursing the costs for essential maintenance of grass cutting, hedge cutting and emptying of the bins. NELC repaid the Parish Council £6,308 towards these maintenance costs during the year 21-22.

## CHANGES TO VOTING RULES WHEN VOTING IN PERSON

All those of you who go along to our Polling Station and vote in person, rather than by postal vote etc., will be required to show photographic ID from this May in order to be able to vote. Your voting card will NOT be enough to allow you to vote and you must take photographic ID with you. This includes a bus pass, driving licence and/or passport.

Postal votes etc. are not affected by this new legislation but for those who attend in person you must provide photo ID.

## Door Step Callers

My name is Nick Hamilton-Rudd, I am the Head of the Probation Service for North & North East Lincolnshire. With regard to concerns about 'door step sellers' in Healing.

## **Planning Matters**

The Parish Council is a statutory consultee of the local Planning Authority, which is North East Lincolnshire Council. The Parish Council is consulted on every planning application within the Parish and also those which are on its boundary or close to its boundary within a neighbouring Parish.

During the course of the year 46 planning applications and/or planning appeals were considered. All planning applications and comments made by the Parish Council are published each month in the Healing Village News and are contained in the minutes published on the Parish Council website.

## **Healing Village Newsletter**

The Parish Council continued with the Newsletter throughout the year. The Newsletter goes to every household in the village and this is carried out by a team of local Healing-based young people who act as a distribution team for the Parish Council.

Although village groups advertise their events for free and publish monthly reports, advertising space is professionally sold within the magazine and this income helps to support the cost of producing the Newsletter. Advertising brought in £2,888 revenue during the year which is approximately a 50% increase on previous years.

The Newsletter is now being printed in full colour.

The Parish Council is grateful to all those who have advertised their services or business during 22/23 through the Newsletter and also to the local village groups who submit their articles for each edition.

## Swifts and Swift Boxes

The number of breeding swifts has dropped by over 50% in 11 years

A major cause is a reduction in the number of suitable nest sites

The boxes need to be 5m (16 feet) from the ground with a clear flight path, and in the shade or on a North or North West facing wall.
