



POLICE REPORT

Wolds Ward Healing Update September 2023

Crime

There were thirty six reported crimes across the Wolds Ward during August. The following offences were reported in Healing.

During the early hours of 23rd August, an attempt was made to enter a secure garage on Fords Avenue. No entry was made.

During the early hours of 16th August, a vehicle parked on Fords Avenue was entered. This activated the vehicles alarm, which made the offenders leave the area.

View from the Pew

I wonder what your first thought is when you hear the word "Home"? I think that it is one of the most emotive words in the English language!

Probably the most common thought is about where a person lives. If the home is a comfortable convenient dwelling where there is a family filled with love and joy, it is indeed a place where one wants to be. If the area where the dwelling is located is somewhere where the family has lived for generations, the whole surroundings are home. It can be very precious! My father's family comes from a little village in Buckinghamshire where some of the family have lived for 600 years. Some of my family were instrumental in building the Methodist chapel, and there is a graveyard full of my ancestors. I have never lived there, but it feels like home when I visit.

There is a saying "Home is where the heart is". For some people, it doesn't matter about the place, but the circumstances in which one finds oneself. What are the most important things in one's life? Having a philosophy of life one which one bases the whole of one's thoughts and actions means that wherever the place, it feels that everything is right in the world. This is where faith comes in – Christian or other faiths. My grandmother was devoted to her Christian faith and her church, and my father told me that when she knew she was terminally ill, she simply said" well I'm going home".

This is season of harvest, and the phrase "Harvest home" rings with triumph and assurance, that for another year, food is there to nourish the people who need to be fed. The core of that phrase has been thanks to God for the provision which is needed. So in this harvest season let us give thanks for the provision of what we need, for it is the work of the creator of the universe, whose love for us never changes.

Healing Green Agenda Group

Helping to Save the Planet in Yorkshire & The Humber

Today's biggest environmental issue is, as we see daily on the news, Climate Change. There is now a huge amount of scientific evidence on how we have caused the problem but still no easy way to quickly put it right. There are more and more groups and organisations trying to do their bit and push people in the right direction. One such for our area is the "Yorkshire and Humber Climate Commission" which is linked to the Place-Based Climate Action Network (which is trying to help with the implementation of the government's climate policy). In June a member of the Yorkshire/Humber team gave a very informative presentation on how they are "Working with Town and Parish Councils". In effect, cascading it all down to the next level. It seems that the aims of the Healing Green Agenda Group are exactly what they have in mind and would like to see more of! Their stated aim is to "bring people and organisations together and mobilise action". Amongst other things they have produced a substantial 50 page "Climate Action Plan" and a very good video narrated by Paul Hudson, the Look North weatherman. However, it is still easier said than done as most things turns out to be costly and/or inconvenient – which nobody seems to like.

Most of the real savings and progress appear to happen in the bigger towns, where there are more bad practices that are obviously in need of improvement. In the parishes it is not so clear. Two of their examples are Draughton Parish Council who got a grant to make plans for zero energy installations and Holme Valley Parish Council who produced a Climate Emergency booklet. Still more words than action though.

There are some good links on their website to things like community carbon footprint calculation and minimisation which I will review soon. I have had a good chat with their team, hope to stay in contact and benefit from their ideas and advice as it pops up. We agreed that it's difficult/impossible to get everyone to change their ways so it's more a case of every little helps.

Hoping the grass is getting greener on the other side.
